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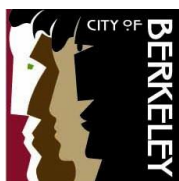

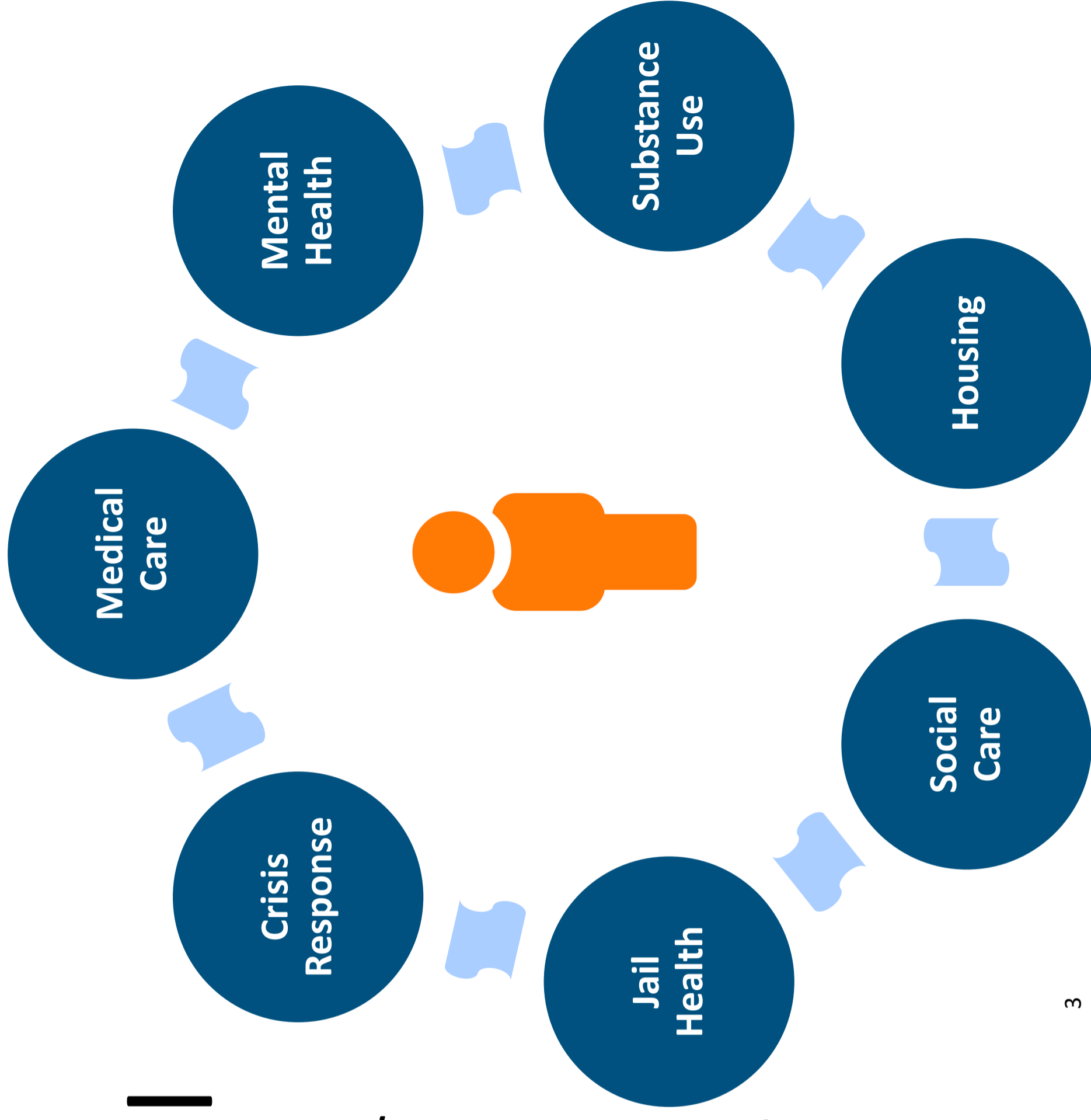

Collaboration on a new level

Individual organizations often have access to one or two data systems.

AC SHIE brings together data feeds from multiple sectors that is shown in the **CHR** to flesh out a more Whole Person perspective.



Major Components

- ✓ **Social/Health Information Exchange or SHIE**
- ✓ A community of organizations sharing data under a **set of agreements** (i.e. according to federal and state regulations), and
- ✓ A platform to **keep data secure, manage who can see what, and match identity** when different data streams describe one person.
- ✓ A **centralized repository of data from different sectors** to allow for more informed program planning & policy development through analytics.



Major Components

- ✓ **Community Health Record or CHR**
- ✓ The first tool drawing from the SHIE rolled out in September 2019.
- ✓ The CHR allows providers to view a thin, timely slice of information on client utilization, diagnosis, and who else is working with them.
- ✓ Allows for more effective and efficient care coordination.
- ✓ 30+ organizations, 100+ programs, and 1000+ users have been onboarded

 - ✓ Includes non-HIPAA-covered organizations



Data Security and Privacy

The Structure

- **Regulatory Pathways for Information Redisclosure**
 - ✓ Treatment, Payment, and Operations activities among HIPAA-covered entities
 - ✓ Consumer consent
 - ✓ CHR User roles
- **Organizational Attribution of Records**
 - ✓ An organization can only view a consumer's CHR if it holds responsibility for that consumer or has provided service to that consumer.
 - ✓ Care relationship identified through data feed(s) or “self attribution”
 - ✓ This limits the pool within all Alameda County Medi-Cal and uninsured consumers

Data Security and Privacy

- **In comparison with six other information exchanges, the SHIE:**
 - ✓ Is the only system fully dependent on organizational attribution
 - ✓ Has comparable audit processes depending on both automated and central staff
 - ✓ Is on the leading edge with two others to engage non-HIPAA covered entities

Mental Health Services Report

Please find attached the report on Mental Health Services for April, 2021. I've added available detail from Mobile Crisis Log for Mobile Crisis Team Incidents. YellowFin, the Alameda County reporting system, did not have Focus on Independence Team (FIT) data for May – I've sent an inquiry to Alameda County to fix this issue.

Mobile Crisis Team (MCT) Data

There was a request for more detail on MCT data provided in the monthly services report. The information in that report is drawn from the Mobile Crisis Incident Log, a City of Berkeley HIPAA secure record keeping system that has a limited number of fields to record information. This database allows staff to select by program (Mobile Crisis Team, Transitional Outreach Team, or Community Assessment Team) and record information on demographics along with providing a field for recording clinical notes.

An "Incident" would be any significant contact between a member of the community and staff, including referrals, consults, or services. These incidents could be in an office, in the field, at a person's home, or by phone. The staff record the information available (which sometimes does not include enough information to identify a person or potential client at the time of recording).

Examples include but are not limited to:

- a. Face to face crisis intervention
- b. Phone call with a community member
- c. Collateral provider calling to make a referral to longer term services
- d. Consultation with a treatment provider

The MCT provides a variety of services to the community, beyond responding to mental health crisis in the field and performing 5150 evaluations. These include:

- a. Crisis Counseling

- b. Short term crisis planning
- c. Emotional support
- d. De-escalation
- e. Information and Service Referral
- f. Mediation
- g. Outreach
- h. Encouraging individuals or groups to utilize available voluntary services
- i. Case consultation
- j. Skills building/training
- k. Gathering information about a client, potential client, or concern in the community for referral or future interventions.

The Mobile Crisis Incident Log does not have a field for “outcomes,” and so aggregate reporting of outcomes is not something we can easily report on. Possible outcomes to the interventions provided by the Crisis staff can include but are not be limited to:

- a. Transportation to a receiving facility (if a 5150 evaluation results in a 5150 hold)
- b. Transportation to a medical facility (if medical clearance or check is indicated)
- c. Referral to the Transitional Outreach Team (TOT) in cases where the individual served may benefit from some further linkage to long term services
- d. Connection/linkage to a service provider or other supportive resource (family, faith organization, etc)
- e. Crisis planning that assists the client in meeting their needs in the moment, giving them a strategy to stabilize and address their crisis
- f. De-escalation from their crisis and return to more stable functioning
- g. Building of rapport and relationship for future contacts
- h. Gathering of information that may inform future contacts
- i. Client declining voluntary services

I've included FY20 (the last fiscal year we currently have a disaggregated report for) data on gender and race/ethnicity for MCT in the monthly services report. We will request data for FY21 for the report for the July MHC report, and include yearly data in future reports.

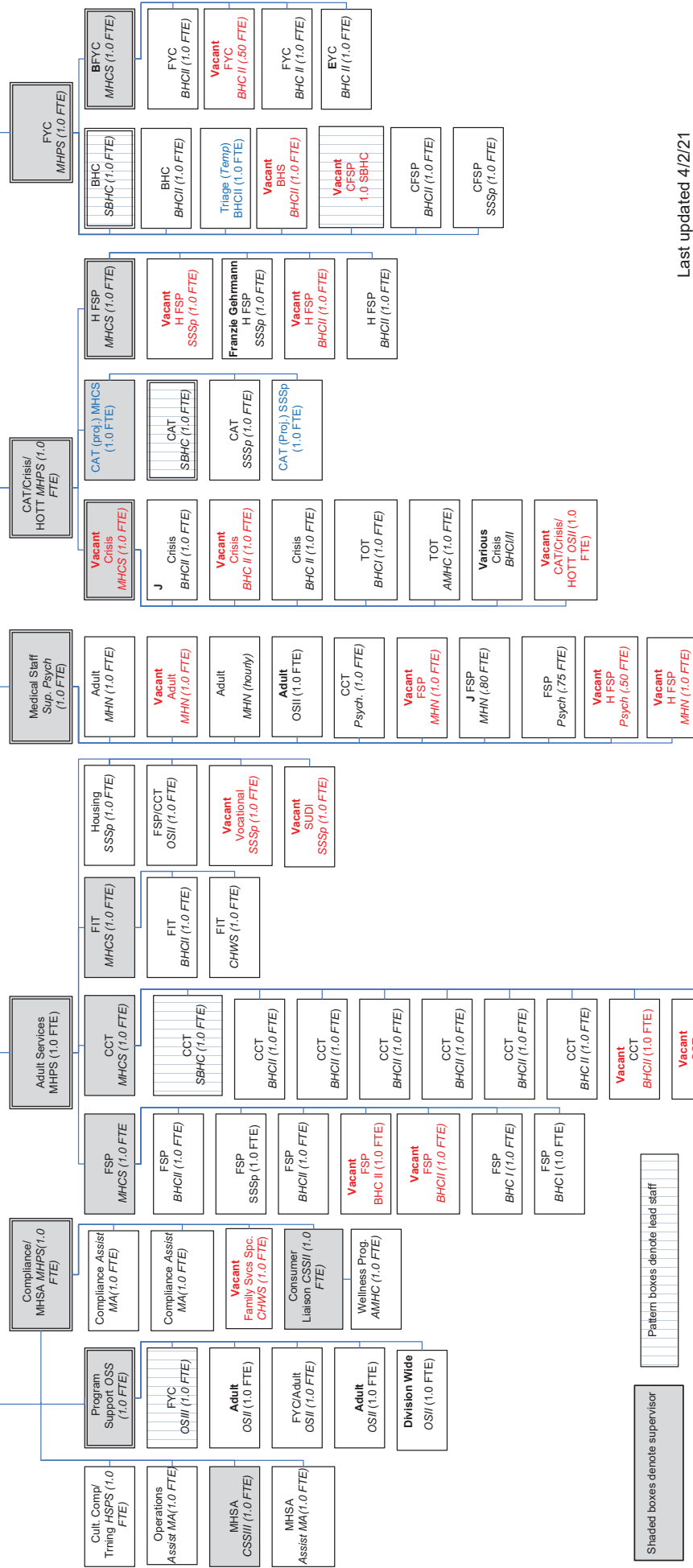

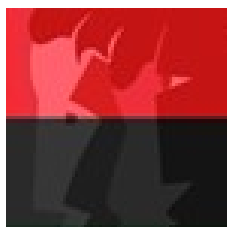

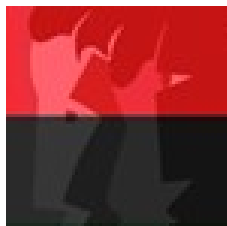
